Violence in the Workplace CODE WHITE

CODE WHITE

PURPOSE:

- 1. In response to a situation when a person's behaviours have escalated to the point of real or perceived physical aggression
- 2. To provide a person exhibiting responsive behaviours with the best and safest care until they regain control of their behaviour
- 3. To prevent injury to the aggressive person, resident, staff and others
- 4. To prevent property damage

INITIATING THE CALL:

Staff involved in situation or first staff member to come upon the scene:

- 1. Identify that a situation exists requiring immediate assistance
- Ensure own and co-worker safety (e.g. need to leave area until sufficient resources are available to restrain or remove the person exhibiting responsive behaviour)
- Call for assistance (yell out "Code White", blow whistle, requesting assistance via phone, page Code White, press emergency button on nurse call system)
- 4. Direct other staff as necessary to reduce stimulation in the area (removing all residents, visitors from area, reducing noise levels by turning off radios/TVs, vacuum cleaners etc.)
- 5. If the incident involves a resident, have resident's chart available if needed and use your GPA training as needed
- 6. Provide information to RN about the situation, action taken and possible action required
- 7. In the event medication is to be administered ensure medication orders are in chart and have medication prepared
- 8. In the event that additional assistance is required (e.g. Police) ensure that the call has been placed and that help is on its way

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- 9. Assist as directed by RN
- 10. When the Police arrive on the scene, they assume control of the situation directing staff and others as necessary

POLICE WILL BE CALLED:

- 1. Whenever there is a real or perceived threat that lives are in danger
- 2. When the initial staff or the RN determines the situation is beyond their abilities.

BE PREPARED TO ANSWER QUESTIONS SUCH AS THE FOLLOWING WHEN CALLING THE POLICE:

- 1. What is the nature of the incident? (i.e. person out of control, person with knife etc.)
- 2. Where is the incident occurring?
- 3. What exactly is the person doing?
- 4. Does the person have a weapon? Describe what it is? What is the person doing with the weapon?
- 5. Has anyone been injured?
- 6. How many people in total are in the room?
- 7. Can they safely leave?
- 8. Describe the person (name if known, race, sex, height, weight, colour/style of hair, clothing, etc.)
- 9. If the person leaves, what is the direction and means of travel? How long ago did the person leave?
- 10. Who is a witness/contact person and where are they?
